Current research projects focus on pedagogical and psychological assessment and intervention, neurorehabilitation, inclusive education, empowerment, equal rights and social inclusion of children and adults with disabilities, among others. Emancipatory and participatory research is another innovative opportunity.

While it is our goal to provide students with individualized programs to meet their academic and career objectives, we also believe that all students need a basic understanding of theories and research methods across fields of specialization. In addition to the coursework, students acquire relevant research skills and knowledge by participating in various research workshops and by joining faculty members' research groups.
